SOLDIERS WHO PAID THE PRICE  
Information Wanted.

The committee appointed by the Town Council at its session on Monday evening, August 27<sup>th</sup>, has prepared as part of its duty the accompanying list of names, of men claiming Port Hope as their home, have surrendered their lives in action or died otherwise in the discharge of their military duties. The committee has done its best to make the list complete up to the present time, but, lest it may have overlooked some names that ought to be there, it calls upon the relations and friends of such to telephone or see at once Mr. R.A. Mulholland, Mayor, and make the necessary corrections. The men who have done so much for us, must not be allowed to be forgotten in the years to come, and it is hoped that no personal feeling of modesty or grief will be allowed to stand in the way of doing these men an act of simple justice.

In addition to the names already secured and those that may be added, the committee would like to have a brief sketch of the military careers of these men that may be kept on record and possibly used in a memorial booklet at some future date. These sketches should include the full names of the men, their regimental numbers, the units in which they enlisted, the date of enlistment, the units to which they were transferred, their rank at death, the engagements as far as possible in which they participated, when and where wounded, honors won, the date and manner of death. It would be greatly appreciated if these particulars and accurately set forth. They will be typewritten and filed in the Mayor's office to be used at such time as it may seem suitable to make public acknowledgement of the sacrifices of these men.

Above all the committee desires to have a good photograph of each man; one that to the relative or friend best recalls the personality of the deceased soldier. This is an important feature of the idea which the citizens have in mind as expressed by the Town Council and it is hoped that all will assist in this effort. It will be the duty of the committee to continue this work until the war is ended and it will be grateful for information that will further its object.
